Introduction

Every year the European Christian Environmental Network (ECEN) offers to the churches some liturgical material on themes related to God's creation for use during the Creation Time in September/October. In 2007 we deviated from this tradition. In view of the Third European Ecumenical Assembly (EEA3) which was held from 4-9 September 2007 in Sibiu, ECEN prepared, in line with previously published liturgical materials, a broader publication "Time for God's Creation." The aim of this publication was to offer a collection of texts providing a coherent argumentation supporting Time for Creation as a part of the liturgical life of churches in Europe.

The EEA3 in Sibiu was a significant moment in this effort. The Assembly fully endorsed the proposal for Time for Creation. In the final Message the Assembly participants expressed the need for protection of God's Creation in the following words: "Concerned about God's creation, we pray for a greater sensitivity and respect for its wonderful diversity. We work against its shameless exploitation, from which the 'whole creation awaits its redemption' (Rom 8:22), and we commit ourselves to working for reconciliation between humanity and nature". These words were then followed by Recommendation Ten: "We recommend that the period from the 1st September to the 4th of October be dedicated to prayer for the protection of Creation and the promotion of sustainable lifestyles that reverse our contribution to climate change".

Following the previous ECEN tradition, as well as reporting the results of the EEA3, ECEN offers to its members, friends and to a wider public a new collection of liturgical material for 2008. The title "Choose life" is related to the theme of the 7th ECEN Assembly which will take place from 24-28 September 2008 in Milan (Italy) on the theme "The real challenge of climate change". The biblical approach to the Assembly theme is supported by the passage from Deuteronomy 30,19. Thinking about the challenges of climate change we have to face today, the biblical parallel urging us to *choose life* is one which is appealing also in our modern era. The impact of climate change urges us to take this question seriously.

Time for Creation 2008 is also a moment to hold in our memories our dear colleague and friend Prof. Lukas Vischer. For him honouring and celebrating Time for Creation was one of the crucial activities of ECEN. The collection "Choose life" is dedicated to him and to his ceaseless efforts to intensify work on the protection of Creation inside the European churches. It is our hope that this material will contribute to the continuation of his work.

The collection of liturgical material for 2008 is a collective work. Many thanks to all who contributed to it. A special "thank you" to Eleanor Todd for her efforts in collecting the material.

It is the hope of all who contributed to this collection that those who will use it will also enjoy it. We will be pleased to receive any comment, reaction or simple indication that this collection has been used.

IV. Reflections on Scripture

♦ A conversation

This is based on Job 1:1, 2:1-10 where God and Satan are in conversation. God is sitting in a chair and Satan wanders round him as if in charge. The conversation doesn't come to a conclusion but it meant to hang in the ambiguity of what will happen next. Do we hear the message and the warning?

God:Well, well, well... the wanderer returns. Where on earth have you been? More worryingly, what have you been up to?

Satan: Oh, you know... strutting around the planet, here and there. Ducking and diving; bobbing and weaving. I must say, God, you truly have excelled yourself this time. What a wonderful creation. So many colours and textures and intricate details. I love what you've done with the fiords of Norway, and the mountain ranges, who would have thought you could have invented so many shades of purple. Wonderful.

God: Well, I'm quite pleased with it myself. But I doubt you have come to pay a compliment. What have you really come here for?

Satan: Oh God, you are too cynical. Though now you mention it, I do have an idea I'd like to propose. Truly you have made a wildly wonderful world. But how good is it really? Come on God... I see a flaw in the whole thing. You have created something on a massive scale. It knits together in the most ingenious ways, but I do believe there is a crucial glitch.

God: Oh? And that would be...?

Satan: Why, the human of course. It was all very worthy of you to create a being so imaginatively in your image. Personally I feel there is a little pride in that which is really not worthy of you, a little arrogance even which will be this creation's downfall.

God: Nonsense. Look at my man Job. What do you make of him now? Still spiritual, moral, good living. Still giving me total respect. Still steering clear of evil. He passed the acid test and his integrity's intact, even though, for no good reason, you were hell bent on destroying him.

Satan: Yeah, but he's not exactly stereotypical, is he? I reckon that if you hit any human with something really nasty, something that hurts physically, they'll spend their last breath cursing you.

God: Never.

Satan: I beg to differ. Give me the human and I'll prove to you how arrogant you have been, for the humans will not only destroy themselves, they'll destroy your creation. Indeed, a person will give up beauty before they will give up power. I am sure it is so.

God: Nonsense.

Satan: And a person will give up on justice before they give up on the coffee they choose to drink. **God:** I don't believe it to be so.

Satan: And a person will turn a blind eye to a changing climate before they chose a different lifestyle.

God: Do you really think humans are that shallow? What about the good they do? They are wonderfully made. When you look in their eye you see a reflection of love. When you create each one's fingerprints or whisper their name calling them into the world, they are in the image of heaven. When you fill a flower with perfume or colour, an autumn leaf with sunsets, you know their souls soar with the breath of it.

Satan: Yes, but when a person does not get what they want, they will curse you to your face. They will take the good, but not the bad. Simple fair-weather fans. Worse still, they'll deny their part in the web of creation. They will believe they stand against it, willing to fight it, as ruler, as sovereign. **God:** You think so? Well have your way with them. Take the human and see if it is true. I created them with a love that is part of their every atom. They will see the truth, they will know the wonder,

they will live in justice, they will share what I have given them, and they will step lightly in this world. They will not covet it, but care for it. It is how I created them. And they know their Creator.

God: Yes, we shall...

♦ The energy of Creation and Salvation

Voice A stands in the centre with B and C are far away to either side. During the conversation B and C move slowly towards A so that by the end they are side by side.

- **A:** Excuse me, You, over there in the distance. Who are you? I can only just see you.
- **B:** I am the energy of creation, born out of the nature of love that longs to create the Other and to give that Other which is creation its own beauty, creativity, potential and freedom.
- **A:** Excuse me, You, over there in the distance. Who are you?
- **C:** I am the energy of salvation, born of the nature of love that longs to redeem the broken beauty, the cramped creativity, the purposeless potential and fraught freedom of the Other which is the whole of creation.
- **A:** And what is your energy?
- **B:** You would know it only as the light which enlightens everyone who comes into the world. The light that is both wave and particle. The light that transforms all things. The light that creates the conditions for life. The light that is the Word of Life and calls others to be creative in their co-creating.
- C: You would know it only as the light that shines in the dark. The light that cannot be overcome by the dark. The light that shines from within. The light that gives light and is the Word of life. The light of Emmanuel.
- **A:** So you are the energy and light of creation?
- **B:** Yes.
- **A:** And you are the energy and light of salvation?
- C: Yes.
- **A:** So how is that you two have grown so far apart and now only talk to each other from such a great distance?
- **B:** We have been talking to each other with one voice from the very beginning.
- C: It is you that have kept us apart in your doctrines, dogmas and dualisms, in your vision and values, in your aspirations and attitudes, above all in your religion and rituals.
- **B:** For we are one and the church has separated us. Some who seek for salvation and celebrate its story in Christ turn their back on creation and its goodness. They have forgotten that, through Christ, all things came into existence.
- C: Those who seek to understand and celebrate creation, turn their back on the Christ who is the beginning and the end of all things. They have forgotten that the One through whom all things are created is the One who suffers and dies to redeem, reconcile, restore and renew.
- **B:** We are the same agency of creation, inspired by the same Spirit.
- **C:** And of redemption.
- **B:** And the same source of inspiration and creativity.
- **C:** Search now in your hearts and you will find it so.
- **B:** Open your hearts and minds and let the same Spirit speak to you who was in Jesus and in the acts of creation. There is so much waiting to be learnt and discovered by you.
- **C:** Then you will know the truth in all its potential and beauty, close to your own creativity.

- **B:** Then you will see the light and energy of all things shining in the glory of God who is creator, redeemer and inspirer.
- C: Then perhaps you will turn and notice this light and energy wherever you look and in whatever you do.
- **B:** Then perhaps you will understand what responsibility has been given to you for all you see and all you do.
- C: In that seeing and doing, you will come to know the source and purpose of all things.
- **B:** And you will see and do things by the light and energy that has been given to you and to all things.
- **C:** Then perhaps you will glimpse us together not apart.
- **B:** Then perhaps you will understand and perceive all things differently.

• Eucharistic Prayer

My friends, every family sits round a table there to share news from the day concerns about life stories they have heard.

I invite you now to sit round this table to share the day listen to concerns of the world speak of the great family of creation and listen to God's story.

It's a special table because it is big enough for all it's a special table because it is made from the world: wood and ore and holds grain and grape gifts from the world. It's a special table because Jesus is here.

So let's share God's story.

Holy God there is no other God. Bless the one who bears God's name. Holy God there is no other God. Heaven and earth and full of your glory.

Voice 1:

I remember the time of creation, of choosing colour and texture, of mountain height and valley depth. I remember how God sculpted love into it all, every nook and cranny alive with the promise of heaven. And we give thanks for it all, its richest splendour and darkest secret.

Voice 2:

I remember the parting of the water, of the choice of Moses to follow God into the wilderness, of the elements against them but the promise for them, choosing to go where God led, into a future where water flowed from rock and manna waited in the morning. We give thanks for it all, the story of exodus, of red sea, and the land of milk and honey.

Voice 3:

I remember the prophet Joel's voice calling the people of Israel to choose a new way of living, in justice with creation and each other, to care for the widow and the orphan and to know what would happen if they carried on as they were. And we give thanks for it all, the choice to hear God's longing for a new world, and to change and follow it.

Voice 4:

I remember the Baptist, who lived in the wilds and spoke of a new heaven and earth, who shouted at the world to choose new ways to live, that recognised justice and full living, who took water and blessed its use and we give thanks for it all, being born into a world renewed by our right living.

Voice 5:

I remember the table-setter Jesus, who chose to upset tables in the temple, who took bread and wine, the simplest of food, and blessed it and held it and broke it and shared it with people like ourselves, his friends, and said, all these stories hold the key to heaven. This bread and wine speaks about a choice to make, to follow me into a world renewed by love, where all creation rejoices in God. Come and choose to eat and drink and belong to my new community, a way of living that will not let go the world, a way of loving that makes the difficult choice but the right one to stick by what is broken and bring it to new birth. Come, follow me! Come eat and drink and know I go before you.
